## Hockey World Cup Masters 45 Men

## Tournament Regulations

## 1. Principles

All participating teams and players agree that the tournament shall be played in a spirit of international friendship, fair play and respectful competition.

All teams and players accept the decisions taken by the tournament organising committee.
2. Age rules

Players from around the world may nominate as a team, or offer to play in a team to be formed, provided they have attained, or will attain during the calendar year of the tournament 45 years of age.

A Team may register for each match two underage players, provided they are not more than twenty four (24) months under the prescribed age at the commencement of the tournament. This and any further exception from theses rules are only possible if necessary to field an adequate squad and have to be agreed by the tournament organising committee.
3. Number of players

Each team has to nominate max. 16 players for each match out of the total number of registered players for the tournament.
4. Tournament format

The tournament will be played in two rounds. During the first round there will be a certain number of matches for each team with reduced playing time. To find an appropriate level of performance for each team the teams will be divided into a "Golden Group" and a "Silver Group" for the second round.

The tournament schedule will be fixed with reference to the schedule of the BDO Hockey World Cup in Moenchengladbach.
5. Medical Indemnity, etc.

The tournament organising committee and the Crefelder Hockey and Tennis Club will accept no liability for personal accident, injuries, or death incurred on the CHTC club grounds during the course of the tournament and its related activities, and for any ensuing medical or hospital costs. Players should be aware that it is customary that all hospital and medical costs incurred, including transportation costs where necessary, are paid by the individual at the time of the treatment for injury.

Also all players and officials have sole responsibility for their personal possessions and sporting equipment during the tournament.

The organising committee strongly recommends that each player ensures that he has sufficient personal insurance cover for all such eventualities.
